## Wrestling at its Finest!

- Wrestling - The wrestling team competed at the 2011 National Collegiate Wrestling Association National Championships held Mar. 10-12 in Macon, Ga. and finished seventh out of 77 teams.
- Wrestling - Three wrestlers earned NCWA All-American honors: junior Marcus Chevres took third place at 133 pounds, while junior Ricky Anderson was sixth at 157 and freshman Willy Crawford was fourth at 184 pounds. That makes 70 All-Americans in the 13 years the Builders have participated in the NCWA.
- Wrestling - While at the tournament, both Anderson and Chevres won their 100th career bouts for the Builders joining three others in the Centurion Club. Anderson also won his 50th bout of the year becoming the first Builder wrestler to win 50 matches in a season.
- Baseball - The baseball team completed a 4-1 weekend with a pair of doubleheader sweeps of Penn State Beaver (Mar. 11) and St. Vincent's College (Mar. 12) to raise its record to 12-6.
